- Working with Ian Albinson of Bristol CORE
  - o Business interest to bring travelers with electric vehicles to Bristol
- Possible location in parking lot to the east of Shaws
  - o Brendan to contact Therese for Town connection to the Pomerleau Agengy to pursue permission
  - o 2 parking spaces would be needed
  - o Level 2 chargers because no 3-phase power
    - Takes 2 hrs to charge a car
- Other locations pretty much ruled out
  - o Howden Hall, the Green, Old High School, Merchants Bank
- Next steps for grant application
  - o March/April grant request due (State, GMP)
  - o Bob to contact Middlebury Energy Committee to get copy of their grant request

  - Should get our application in soon to get in the queue for when it is approved
- Status of ACORN's 150KW CS in Shoreham no update
- Bob to re-look at the Bridport site as it may meet the proposed GMP requirements

# 7) John McCormick – Preparing VT for Climate Change Future

- Comprehensive Energy Plan (CEP)
  - o 90% of VT Energy needs by 2050
  - Very far away from that goal
  - Concerns about how the costs will affect individuals
- Alternative Carbon Tax proposal
  - Discussion about carbon tax revenues
    - Revenue neutral dividends may not achieve change in habits
    - Suggestion: Revenues go to help people reduce the cost of heating and driving by a great deal more than the cost of the tax

- Tax offsets enhanced rebates (heating and higher MPG cars)
- Income based supports
- There is movement in Republican Party to address climate change
  - o Republicans for Environmental Protection Bob Stetson (Michigan)
  - o Bob Inglis former US Senator TED talk distributed by Wendy
- Climate Change Cabinet Deb Markovitz Sec of Agency of Natural Resources
