1. Public Information Meeting: Emerald Ash Borer.

Emerald ash borer (EAB), a destructive and invasive beetle that feeds on and kills all species of ash trees, has recently been detected in Bristol. Join local and state officials to learn about the insect and its impact in Vermont, what you can do to help slow the spread of EAB, and management options for landowners and homeowners.
