Enclosed please find the third invoice for the work I have done on the project noted above from January - May. During the timeframe of the invoice, I worked with Kris Perlee and Katie Raycroft-Meyer to complete a final draft of Unified Development Regulations, including Subdivision Regulations and a section addressing on farm accessory businesses, conforming with the law passed last legislative session for the Town of Bristol. I also met with the Planning Commission at meetings in April and May to incorporate their feedback and secure their approval of the draft.

Enclosed please find the second invoice for the work I have done on the project noted above from October to December. It also includes some mapping work Kevin did in July. During the timeframe of the invoice, I worked with Kris Perlee to develop Subdivision Regulations for the Town of Bristol. During this time period, we got very close to a draft for the Planning Commission to review. I also exhausted the amount we had budgeted for the project. As you can see the cost exceeds to bill by about \$615. If you go back to review the contract, you will also note that ACRPC did not promise to complete the work for the amount of the contract.
