Dear Addison County Select Boards, Managers, Administrators, and Clerks,

The State of Vermont has issued allocations of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to all of the municipalities in Addison County. Half of the funding goes out this year, and the other half will be distributed in 2022. The state has disbursed the first payment to local governments and the additional first half of county ARPA funding is scheduled to arrive soon, in August or early September. **A letter is attached with additional information.**

We encourage you to **prioritize community investments that will provide long-term economic and community development benefits**. In general, we recommend that you be strategic in leveraging the funds for transformational projects, and reach out to your community for public input. Your town plan goals and priorities are a great place to start for ideas!

ACRPC can facilitate regional-level investments if you would like to partner with your neighboring communities to make your funding go further. Supporting Maple Broadband in some capacity is a great example of how neighboring towns can invest together to create regional infrastructure. We are working with VLCT to create a list of all of the State ARPA program money, so that you can determine whether you may also have access to additional state funding for your projects.

We write today to invite you to update you on the status of the American Recovery Act Plan ("ARPA") aid to cities, towns and villages. The State of Vermont has issued allocations for all of Vermont's "Non-Entitlement communities", which includes all of the municipalities in Addison County. Half of the funding goes out this year, and the other half will be distributed in 2022. All cities, towns, and villages that opted to receive their American Rescue Plan Act Local Fiscal Recovery Funds by electronic means should now have their money; The state disbursed the first payment to local governments on August 9 so please check your bank account. If you opted to receive a paper check, it should arrive within the next two weeks. In addition, the first half of county ARPA funding, also to be distributed to Vermont's towns, is scheduled to arrive in August or early September.

We encourage all of you to consult ACRPC and the Resources and Information section of the VLCT ARPA website (www.vlct.org/arpa) for more information. We urge you to prioritize community investments that will provide long-term economic and community development benefits.
