Dear Oakely,

At their meeting on April 19, 2019, the Bristol Selectboard, in its role as Water Commission, voted to approve your application to install five (5) new water service taps to serve the PUD at 93 North Street with the following conditions:

1. That fifty percent (50%) of the connection fee be paid upfront. Five connections at \$500 each plus the cost of the meter(s) would be $\$2,500 \times 50\% = \$1,250$. The balance of the connection fee(s) would be paid, including the cost of the meter and appurtenances, when the connection is proposed to be completed to each unit based upon the fees in effect at that time.
2. The work must be completed in accordance with the Alison Parker Living Trust Property Water and Wastewater Plan, dated June 17, 2017, Green Mountain Engineering and Lincoln Applied Geology, Inc and State of Vermont Wastewater and Potable Water Supply Permit WW-9-2448.
3. The existing line from the main to the curb stop for 93 North Street should be replaced at the same time the five new taps are being installed. The Water District will provide the materials. Please coordinate with Bristol's Water Operator, Vermont Utility Management Services (VTUMS) at (802) 377-2316 and/or info@vtums.com.
4. The water line installation should be coordinated with the installation of the approved underground utilities conduit.
5. All excavation and restoration must be completed as outlined in the approved permits for work in the Town highway right-of-way and petition for use of the public right-of-way for buried utilities.
6. The Selectboard authorized closure of North Street in accordance with MUTCD standards to accomplish the work as expeditiously as possible. Please coordinate with the

Public Works Department regarding the schedule so public notice can be provided prior to the street closure. Contact: (802) 453-4707 or bristolhighway@gmavt.net.

7. All work must be completed well in advance of the paving scheduled for the second week of May 2019 and the excavated areas properly restored to help ensure adequate compaction and settling prior to the paving.
8. Pavement affected by the excavated areas must be guaranteed for one year from the date of completion.
