

SPECIAL REGULATIONS AS TO SPEED LIMITS
IN THE
VILLAGE OF BRISTOL

No, The Trustees of the Village of Bristol, pursuant to Section 10, 284 of the Vermont Statutes, Revision of 1947, as amended by No. 98 of the Acts of 1957, do hereby make the following special regulation in regard to the speed of motor vehicles operating over, along and upon the streets within the limits of the Village of Bristol.

BE IT ORDERED BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BRISTOL AS FOLLOWS:

1. No motor vehicle shall be operated or driven in the Village of Bristol, Vermont upon any public street within the limits of the Village of Bristol at a rate of speed greater than thirty(30) miles per hour.

2. Signs indicating the speed limit as hereinabove set forth shall be posted conspicuously within the highway limits at least 200 feet ahead of the points where such speed limit provided in this special regulation become effective.

3. A person who violates this special regulation as to the operation and driving of a motor vehicle shall be fined or imprisoned according to Section 10,326 of the Vermont Statutes, Revision of 1947.

4. This regulation shall take effect the 11th day of November 1957.
