#### **Meeting Notes**

- 1. Organize for 'Window Dressers' insert build at Middlebury this year: outreach, home visits/measuring, Middlebury build volunteers.
- We need a small team to measure their windows. Sally Burrell, Mike, Sally Roth and Richard Butz will measure. Richard has a laser measurer.
- Sally will begin advertising on FPF
- We will advertise and sign up participants at the Harvest Festival.
- Need measurement and pricing instruction and procedures.
- Need last date to order
- Richard will get the WD information above from WD

### 2. Oct 1st, EV Demo Day at the Green

- GMP will be there with cars and Jen, from GMP, will ask Bristol owners to bring their cars.
- Richard will confirm electric motor cycle presence
- John McCormack will talk to Caleb Elder, an advocate of e-bikes, to see if he can get some e-bikes for people to see/ride?

# 3. EV Charging Stations

- Downtown, and multi housing locations are going to have funds available through various state and federal programs.
- John McCormack says the Bristol ARPA lineup includes the park site quote from Norwich EV.
- Richard and John will check on available programs and talk to Valerie Capels re: multi-family sites that should be considered for chargers.

# 4. Library Energy Audit update

• Recommendation to use Building Energy of Williston to provide audit, and costs so we can be ready to apply for applicable grants. The idea is to prepare a "shovel-ready" application.

- The recently passed H.518 Municipal Fuel Switching program is designed for this kind of project.
- Building energy is one of two companies recommend by Efficiency Vermont.
- We will consult with the library board to see if they are on board with the project and plans so far.
- We will try to get on the next Select Board agenda to request \$600 to fund the audit.
- This discussion raised the issue that the Energy Committee has no allocation of discretionary funding from the town and we need to discuss this at a future meeting.

#### 5. Climate and Energy Conversations

• Richard started conversations on FPF, and met in person at the Band Shell. This is part of a 350VT, Addison Node "Listening Project" to try to understand where Vermonters stand on climate change and it's potential impact. The conversations will resume on FPF and Harvest festival.

### 6. Harvest Festival Sat. Sept 24

- Conversations about climate change will continue at the festival we'll try to get permission to use 350VT post cards prepared for the Listening Project. We may also make some Bristol-specific cards.
- We'll bring electric lawn equipment
- We'll hand out Efficiency VT and Button-up materials.
- We'll have Window Dressers sign-ups and materials for clients and workers.
- Sally will arrange for the booth rental
- 7. John McCormack presented an idea to encourage the state to buy EV's for state use and then surplus them after two years at cost to low income people.
- He has spoken to the director of VT general services about the idea, to gain an understanding of the procurement process.
- John was advised to talk to Senator Bray, Representatives Cordis and Elder for advice and support for the idea. Richard will work with him on this project.
