PROPOSAL 2

To see if the voters will amend the Vermont Constitution by amending Article 1 of Chapter 1 to read:

"Article 1. [All persons born free their natural rights; slavery and indentured servitude prohibited] That all persons are born equal! free and independent, and have certain natural, inherent, and unalienable rights, amongst which are the enjoying and defending life and liberty, acquiring, possessing protecting property, and pursuing and obtaining happines and safety; therefore no person born in this country; or brough from over sea, ought to be holder by law; to serve any person as a servant, slave or apprentice, afte arriving to the age of twenty-one years, unless bound by the person's own consent, afte arriving to such age, or bound by law for the payment of debts damages, fines, costs, or the like slavery and indentured servitude in any form are prohibited.
