- Do not vote for more candidates than the "VOTE for NOT MORE THAN #" for an office.
- If you make a mistake, tear, or deface the ballot, return it to an election official and obtain another ballot. DO NOT ERASE.

<b>PROPOSAL 2</b> To see if the voters will amend the Vermont Constitution by amending Article 1 of Chapter 1 to read:  "Article 1.
