- We are willing to have Conservation Commission next month
- Jim Q. mentioned that there is someone to contact about feasibility of not mowing Sycamore. Bristol Rec (Meredith) should be involved as well.

# 350VT Post Card

- Richard has provided a link in the agenda to the post card template to emphasize the public's interest and motivation to get the energy-related bills through the Legislature. All interested parties should fill out the card and get it to Richard.

- The push is to keep pressure on the Legislature to get legislation through that gets Vermont to legally meet its existing legal requirements.

# Updates on Important Energy Related Bills in the Legislature

- H.56 bill was to implement regulatory process to incentivize VT Gas (and any other VT org, town, NGO, etc.) to incentivize use of district geothermal energy projects along with complex ratepayer protections, and restrictions on VT Gas territorial expansion.
  - H.56 Steering Committee has been working on the bill to keep it moving. There has been push back from existing gas companies to try to sink the important provisions that protect rate payers and implementing restrictions on territorial expansion (despite their own business plan saying they won't expand territory)
- H.56 is now H.242. H.242 is only district geothermal (removed rate payer

protections/restrictions on territorial expansion).

- Geothermal utilizes the stability of the internal consistent temperature of the ground instead of air (like a heat pump)
- Geothermal heat exchangers are not feasible on a home-by-home basis, in general. District geothermal is more palatable because it can serve a diverse array of building types/sizes (houses, schools, businesses, etc.)
- Geothermal is important replacement for fossil fuel projects (for example, Middlebury townhouses going up on Seminary Street extension)
- Ratepayer Protection bill has been tabled for now.
- Affordable Heat Act (discussed last month with Senator Chris Bray) and Renewable Energy Standard are big pushes for the Natural Resources Committee in the legislature. Expectation is that both bills will be passed during this session (during this biennial at the least)
- Affordable Heat Act is very tricky because of the reliance on home heating oil for consumers and distributer/workers who deliver the fuel. The goal of the bill is to eliminate fossil fuel for heating in VT (big ask). 75% of the money spent on fossil fuels in VT is sent out of state. AHA is trying to solve that. Act is heavy on heat pumps and weatherization. Hard to not hurt consumer and oil dealers unduly though. Geothermal is a part of this AHA as well.
- Weekly updates on Friday from VPIRG/Vermont Conservation Voters for these important bills
- Reach out to our legislators with questions: Chris Bray (Senate), Ruth Hardy (Senate), Caleb Elders (Representative), Mari Cordes (Representative). They are passionate about these issues and want to get these bills passed.

EV Chargers Update

# Pocock Rocks and Farmers Market

- Bristol Farmers Market may be coming back! If it does, do we want to have a booth on a regular or semi-regular basis? Ideally yes but seems impractical. Something to consider even once or twice during the Farmers Market run this year if it indeed comes back.
- Pocock Rocks we should have a booth. Something to consider. No date known yet.
  - Before Bristol, the town was known as Pocock.
  - Pocock Rocks is a late spring/early summer celebration event with music, local merchants, etc.

Weatherizing Peoples Homes - Potential Outreach Opportunity

- Potential to organize a team of folks to help community members to weatherize homes, similar to the Window Dressers model of community-organized construction. Potential to enlist Hannaford Career Center students?
  - Richard mentioned that Brandon Energy Committee could be a good resource to help understand how we can organize this in Bristol. Keep it on the list for our meeting with

Brandon in early March.
