IV. Sidewalk/Infrastructure Audit

Students from Middlebury College Community Engage Practicum, along with Maddison Shropshire of ACRPC presented a sidewalk audit of Bristol's infrastructure. This is the first of its kind and will become a model for other towns to adopt. See the video recording to learn more about their findings. *Not posted to Youtube as of 4/28.*

After walking the entire village sidewalk grid, the group analyzed various conditions of health for each street describing the methodology and supporting this with images. Using R, a data analysis software, they took this information and highlighted where sidewalks are in good shape, as well as where improvements are needed.

The group will share this data with links to their findings. The public, including Town Administrators, will have access to this data along with their maps. Valerie can use this information to suggest where funding is best utilized and to establish the construction bidding process.

Next steps: Students will be setting up maps within the next few weeks to seek public comments regarding this data, how they use sidewalks, hearing stories and engaging with the public.

A discussion ensued regarding how valuable this information is but to highlight the lack of sidewalks in town, specifically Pine and Mountain Streets.

Future surveys to layer in to this initial phase could include bike racks, stop signs, crosswalks, etc.

V. Quarterly Initiative

Ideas to present to the Selectboard:

1. Assisted Crosswalks: one at the Spring to Pleasant to West Pleasant (Mountain to Liberty)

2. Traffic Calming needed on Mountain to Devino Lane. The sidewalk ends on Mountain/Devino. Devino to North Streets

3. Additional Bike racks: locations TBD

VI. Other Business

Traffic study (speed and vehicle count on Mountain/Devino) Police Chief or ACRPC could assist. Volunteers could count pedestrians at the same time this data is being collected.

Dustin has Strava app heat maps with data on pedestrian use. Demonstrates the most use are streets without sidewalks.
