From the Desk of the Executive Director

We recently wrapped up another exciting and impactful fiscal year. During FY23, ACEDC conducted 158 business visits, 14 business education and networking events, sent countless communications about state and federal programs, and spent many hours on grant research, application, assistance, and administration.

During FY23, ACEDC was involved directly (as applicant, recipient, or administrator) and indirectly (as advocate, advisor, or supporter) in bringing another \$5.6 million in grants and loans to the region. ACEDC won six "Building Community" Economic Development grants from BGS, totaling about \$53,000 and leveraging \$1.6 million in capital investments and new job creation by six area small businesses. To date, 10 Addison County projects have been awarded \$3.3 million in Community Recovery and Revitalization Program grants (the second highest number and dollar value for a county in VT), including three housing projects and three early childhood education projects. Our loan program helped bring a new family of six to the area and kept a hospitality property locally owned and operated. We received a \$50,000 grant through USDA/Rural Development to conduct a Feasibility Study to scale up ACORN's Champlain Valley Food Hub and add a Commercial Community Kitchen. Partnerships are key to ACEDC's impact in the region. Much of what we do, especially to advance the underlying infrastructure of economic development - such as workforce development, housing,

childcare, broadband - is through partnerships regionally and at the state and federal levels. Regionally, we partner with the Addison County Chamber to offer business education programs and to market the region. We partner with our wonderful municipalities on infrastructure and development projects and the three downtown organizations on events and regional marketing. We work with the Addison County Regional Planning Commission on numerous projects such as the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) and brownfields identification and assessment. We have projects underway with several other regional partners such as ACORN, the United Way of Addison County, and Addison Housing Works. ACEDC convenes the Addison County Partners and the Addison County Workforce Alliance to encourage coordination and collaboration. At the state level we partner with our legislative delegation to advance issues and solutions of interest to the business community. We also work closely with several state agencies such as Commerce, Labor, and Agriculture. We have a great working relationship with Efficiency Vermont, ensuring that our businesses are benefitting from the contributions they make through their energy bills. On the federal level, we work closely with our Congressional Delegation and directly with several federal agencies such as USDA/Rural Development, SBA, NBRC, and EDA. Treeline Terrains



Treeline Terrains creates unique 3D map artwork that celebrates the founders' appreciation of the natural world. Alex Gemme, Nathaniel Klein, and Jacob Freedman started their business journey while they were students at Middlebury College. All three wished to remain in Vermont after graduation, and so they founded Treeline Terrains in April of 2021. Over time, they built a name for themselves and demand for their products grew. They moved to a larger shop, invested in more equipment and advertising, and grew some more. As demand continued to increase and another holiday season approached, Alex, Nathaniel and Jacob realized they would need even more equipment to meet demand. Through the Addison County Economic Development Corporation, they were able to secure a BGS (Buildings and General Services) grant that allowed them to effectively double their machinery and keep up with an ever-increasing volume of orders.

Participate in Study of Big Building Energy Use

The energy committees of Bristol, Middlebury, and Vergennes, in collaboration with the Climate Economy Action Center of Addison County (CEAC), have embarked upon a study of Big Buildings and Energy. They are looking for people who own or manage large buildings (e.g. factories, warehouses, stores, office buildings) and are willing to take 20 minutes to answer questions about what they are thinking and doing about the ways they use energy. They would like to understand what actions people have taken or plan to take, what barriers exist to taking action, and what sorts of resources and incentives might help. This in turn will support efforts to support the work of saving money, providing healthier and more comfortable working conditions, and decreasing greenhouse gas emissions. Planning & Environment Linkages (PEL) Study

VTrans, in partnership with ACRPC has launched a public survey for the Vergennes Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) Study.

Help VTrans and the ACRPC explore options for reducing the impacts of truck traffic on VT 22A (Main Street) in Downtown Vergennes and better understand the issues that are important to you.

Transportation solutions being evaluated include new roadways, improvements to existing roadways, and an option where traffic flow does not change. Potentially affected municipalities include Ferrisburgh, Vergennes, Waltham, Weybridge, Panton, Addison and New Haven.

President Biden Approves Major Disaster Declaration for the State of Vermont



FEMA announced that federal disaster assistance has been made available for the state of Vermont to supplement recovery efforts in the area affected by severe storms and flooding that occurred Aug. 3-5, 2023.

The President's action makes public assistance federal funding available to state and eligible local governments and certain private nonprofit

organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of disasterdamaged facilities in Addison County.

Business Emergency Gap Assistance Program

The Department of Economic Development has created the Business Emergency Gap Assistance Program (BEGAP). This \$20 million grant program is for businesses and nonprofits that suffered physical damages from flooding dating back to July 7, 2023. Applicants must intend on restoring, reopening, and bringing their employees back to work as soon as possible and will utilize these grant funds for that purpose.

As of 9/21/2023, BEGAP awards are increasing to get more money to flood damaged organizations. This change is retroactive. The new formula eliminates the prior \$20,000 cap and increases payouts to 30% of net uncovered damages. This change applies to all BEGAP grantees - past, present & future.

The Vermont Main Street Flood Relief Fund is dedicated to providing direct financial aid to Vermont small businesses for the purpose of rebuilding and recovering from damage and losses suffered due to the recent flooding.

Applications are now being accepted. The Fund will be providing up to \$2,500 in grant allocations with the opportunity to reapply as funds become available.
