Hi Jim,

Several weeks ago VTrans or VTrans contract painters painted centerlines on most of our Class 2 paved highways. The painting was done quickly and without notice late one Saturday afternoon. We appreciate the work that was done. However, the painting stopped well short of the Lincoln Bristol town line on West River Road and the continuation of

River Road (named Lincoln Road) in Bristol was left unpainted as well. The total unpainted length is about 3 miles.

The centerline on this road is very important as the road heads uphill into Lincoln and ultimately to Warren following the twists and turns of the New Haven River and negotiating the hills leading to Lincoln Gap. The road is narrow and sorely needs to have the centerline to guide drivers, including snowplows, night and day.

We are certain that this is just an oversight and the paint crew simply forgot to return. We would appreciate your looking into this and letting us know when we can expect to get the lines completed. Time is growing short as temperatures are slated to drop very soon with precipitation returning. (Snow has been mentioned in the forecast already !)

Thanks for your help on this and all you do to assist Lincoln and all towns.
