Hi Folks - just adding my two cents because we just spoke with GMP about this program. I highly encourage you to apply for a DCFC (lv 3) charger in Bristol. You are well situated given their requirements for distance from existing chargers and you have a great public attraction location on the green.

I will just say that the DCFCs are a competitive program while the level 1s and 2s are first come first served. You might consider speaking with business owners who would benefit from the level 2s and help them apply as well. I know the county que still has room for more level 2 projects so it would be worth a try.

Hi Valerie and Ian, last evening the energy committee authorized me to request time to speak to the Select Board regarding two issues:

1. Should we apply for level 3 EV chargers, and if so where will they go? We could apply under the Special Attraction section which means that the chargers would be a special attraction to our downtown area.
2. I'd like an opportunity, at another meeting, to determine if the Town is interested in establishing a Thermal Energy Network that would capture waste heat from businesses, possibly install a geothermal system, and service Holley Hall, downtown businesses and apartments with heat and air conditioning. I'd like to show a short video that describes such a project. There is federal money available for this purpose, I'm told.

Also, we agree to stagger members' terms and are finalizing that now and I get back to you shortly on that.
