Hi Valerie.

We would like to introduce ourselves and to express our interest in being involved in discussions and decision-making processes regarding recent traffic closures and the possibility of closing Briggs Hill Rd. These closures have a significant impact on our residents, and we believe it's important to be part of these conversations.

We are currently completing a traffic study that includes a count of vehicles on West River Rd. The study reveals that approximately 1,700 vehicles use this road daily. Given this volume, it's reasonable to assume that additional vehicles are using Lincoln Rd to access Route 116, especially as you approach Atkins Rd with its further crossroads.

The alternative routes available are far from ideal, adding considerable time to commutes for residents, vendors, and delivery trucks. This also poses challenges for emergency services in the area.

I trust you understand the gravity of these issues. If Bristol were in a similar situation, I am confident that you would ensure the concerns of your residents were given the appropriate consideration at the decision-making level.

There is currently no action item that we are seeking other than working together to address these concerns effectively.

Lincoln Road in Bristol will be closed to all traffic from Briggs Hill Road near Bartlett Falls to Eagle Park beginning Tuesday, September 3 for a major riverbank restoration/repair project in two locations.
