Valerie/Eric,

Kathi and I met at this location today, hoping to design the attached. This is not going to happen. For one, the Hills have since plowed up the field on the east side of Burpee Road to just a few feet away from the pole. Doing what we have planned, we would need to install a push brace (another pole) leaning on this pole and it would be in their plowed field. Furthermore, if we replace the pole on Monkton Road more to the South/East, then we cannot feed Carl Boss, as the service wire would lay on the top of his metal roof. We could try to feed him from the pole at the north end of his property, but again, the distance is too great and would require an additional pole on his property.

Kathi mentioned she thought this would be a great place for concrete barriers in front of the pole. As I have previously mentioned, the Solar Stop light seems like an economical solution (photo attached). GMP can also install a 20 LED street light to one of those poles to light up the intersection at a cost of about \$12.00/month. We seem to be running out of feasible ideas... It would be nice to be proactive here, before a fatality. Thanks

Thank you for stopping by this morning. Attached is the site plan for the Funeral Home's connection of their stormwater basin into the South Street culvert.

As I mentioned, the Selectboard at their last meeting approved installation of a lighted STOP sign at the Burpee Road intersection, but at GMP's cost. They also reiterated their belief that moving the pole a bit further away from the road may be more effective.
